# Safe Gaming

A companion for the grown-up — Tween Bridge, Lesson 2 of 4.

## WHAT THIS LESSON COVERED

---

Your child learned that game chat is full of strangers and that real-life rules about personal information apply there too. They learned the warning sign of a stranger trying to move the conversation to another app or asking for secrecy, that “free Robux / V-Bucks” offers are always scams, that passwords only go in the real login screen, and to ask before any in-game purchase.

## TALK ABOUT IT TOGETHER

---

- 1 Ask which games they play and who they usually talk to in them — just naming names out loud is the win.
- 2 Ask if they’ve seen a “free Robux” or “free V-Bucks” offer, and agree together that it is always a scam.
- 3 Agree on your family’s rule for in-game purchases, so it’s settled before the next ask.

## WHAT TO WATCH FOR

---

- A new online “friend” who wants to move to Discord or Snap, asks for personal details or photos, or asks them to keep secrets.
- Unexpected charges on your account — a sign of a free-money scam or unapproved buying.

### THE HABIT TO REINFORCE

Mute, block, and tell. Using those tools is smart, not “losing” — and make clear they will never be in trouble for telling you about something online.
